Bearing Witness: The Hardest to Share

Spike and I visited several kibbutz communities in the South of Israel to bear witness to the atrocities that were committed there by Hamas. We were very ambivalent about the visit, as we did not want to participate in "trauma tourism."


We prayed for clarity of heart and vowed to be as sensitive as possible. We were asked to tell their story. We took just a few photographs in places we were given permission by a survivor who shared his time with us.

Personally, I was deeply touched by the evidence of young families with children everywhere. This was a place where multiple generations of families lived close together. The terror of being butchered en masse in their own homes is what Hamas broadcasted to the world with glee.

We walked on broken glass through charred and bullet riddled rooms. Carefully pruned rose bushes were in full bloom in front of bombed out homes. The olive grove was witness to a close-range execution of whole families. The kindergarten was used as a terrorist hideout. 10% of the kibbutz members were murdered, many of them elderly grandparents and small children. Women and girls were undeniably subjected to sexual torture. 30 people were abducted (some mothers and children have been returned from captivity, but their fathers and husbands remain hostage). The rest of the kibbutz families were all displaced and are now refugees in their own country. And it's just one of many communities with similar trauma.

Kibbutz Be'eri is hoping to rebuild, but only if Hamas is no longer a threat. I can understand that as a parent, as a woman, as a human. "O healer of broken hearts, binder of their wounds" (Psalm 147:3) May the wisdom of our ancestors help us choose life and be a blessing. May we cultivate אומץ לב-strength of heart to withstand this depth of despair. May the captives survive and be restored to the world of the living. And, please God, help us live into a peaceful future.
